### **Fred Saberhagen, 1930-June29, 2007**

SF and fantasy writer **Fred Saberhagen**, born 1930, died June 29, 2007, at the age of 77. He began publishing in 1961 with short stories in *Galaxy* and *If* magazines, and published collection **Berserker** in 1967, first in a series about interstellar killing machines programmed to destroy all life. Saberhagen's 60+ books also included the Empire of the East sequence, beginning with **The Broken Lands** (1968), the Dracula sequence, beginning with **The Dracula Tape** (1975), and two books co-written with Roger Zelazny, **Coils** (1981) and **The Black Throne** (1990). His last book was **Ardneh's Sword** (Tor, 2006).

## **ApolloCon 2007 Reviews**

### **My trip to Apollo Con 2007**

The first time I heard about role-playing games was when my husband, Sanjay, and I were dating. I still remember how Sanjay went into vivid detail about the game, and it left me wondering whether he would beam me into this sci-fi world he spoke about. Well, he did! Since March, I've been joining Dee, Erika, Anita, Karen, Margaret and Sanjay in thier bi-weekly adventures. At first, I wasn't sure how to proceed with my character. However, as time went on, each adventure seemed to get more exciting, and I was beginning to understand the game. I also attended a Japanese anime film party, hosted by Erika and Dee. If role-playing and anime was fun, I wondered what else science fiction was about. And then, one day:

"Let's go to ApolloCon!," suggested Sanjay, as we planned our to-do's for June. Three years ago, I would have scratched my head and thought ApolloCon was the latest planet to be discovered, however, thanks to Sanjay, I was aware of what "cons" were all about and we jotted down June 22-24/ ApolloCon in our calendar. Unfortunately, he wasn't able to make it, so I ventured off han-solo to my first convention on Sunday, ready to have a great time. As the celebrated science fiction author, Philip K. Dick, once wrote, "This is an illusion. Make good use of your time, buddy boy."

Upon registering, I was steered toward the souvenir shop, where I met Dee and Erika. Now, I had a dungeon master and a hobbit, respectively, to help me navigate this island of sci-fi movies, book readings, ethnic demonstrations, art shows, and on and on! I learned about filking and picked up a Tom Scott CD and an ApolloCon tshirt. Just when I thought I was healthy and ready to leave the souvenir room, I was faced with disease and bacteria. Not just one, but many. There were stuffed diseases on sale! Everything from furry white and red blood cells to black, leathery polio and dusty red salmonella. I ended up taking the fork and knife-studded salmonella home and placed him in the kitchen where he's made himself at home.

The Art Show featured fresh and original works of art. There was jewelry, photo art, paintings and mini sculptures. Having only 15 minutes to shop

before it closed down, I quickly toured the gallery, and settled on a beautiful piece entitled "The Lemon Tree". It's a picture of a lemon tree, but when examined closely, one can notice graceful, mythical creatures perched on the tree limbs, reflecting the blossoms around them. Finally, I had found something meditative to place in our guest bathroom!
